Based on the many positive comments that we received and the number of families that came by last year, Resurrection is once again keeping its gates opened all night on Christmas Eve for those families wishing to visit their loved ones before or after Midnight Mass, or at anytime during the night.

As a result Resurrection's gates will be open from 7 am on Christmas Eve until 5 pm on Thursday, Dec. 26, regardless of the weather. Additionally in recognition of Orthodox Christmas, our gates will open starting at 7 am on Monday, Jan. 6 through Wednesday, Jan. 8 at 5 pm. Our hope is that this will allow families to make their other plans throughout Christmas Eve and Christmas Day without having to worry about rushing around to visit your family members or friends in between other activities. Our Grounds Staff will be available to plow and salt the roads as needed during these days as well.

Remember that this time of year our normal gate hours will be from 7 am to 5 pm daily. Our main office will be open from 9 am to 12 pm on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

Since 2012, Resurrection has hosted a Wreaths Across America event on the second Saturday of December at 12 pm ET, in conjunction with the a national effort to "Remember, Honor and Teach" the sacrifices made by veterans who have passed. A featured wreath-laying ceremony is held at Arlington National Cemetery, as well as at more than 1,600 additional locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea and abroad. Our event at Resurrection is considered to be the second largest in Michigan.

As always Resurrection will be hosting an Honor Ceremony at 10 am at Fern Hill Golf Course before the Wreath Laying Ceremony in memory of our veteran heroes at noon at the American Veterans Memorial on the grounds of Resurrection. Resurrection's sister cemetery Mt. Elliott Cemetery opens section to honor Blessed Solanus Casey

Mt. Elliott Cemetery, one of Resurrection's "sister" cemeteries in Detroit, officially opened its Blessed Solanus Casey Columbarium and Cremation Garden with a Dedication on Friday, Nov. 1 on All Saints Day. Mt. Elliott has long partnered with the Fr. Solanus Casey Center, St. Bonaventure Monastery and Detroit Capuchin Friars for holiday masses and other special events.

The Blessed Solanus Casey Columbarium and Cremation Garden is elegantly designed and honors the memory and lives of those memorialized. It humbly honors Blessed Solanus as a priest, porter, prophet, and spiritual counselor whose prayers are credited with miraculous cures. This elegantly



designed columbarium includes a six-foot statue of Blessed Solanus as a servant of God and the Detroit community. Companion niche fronts include family inscriptions and are finished with gray granite.

Niche fronts are inscribed in a memorial band that embraces the entire columbarium in a never ending symbol of everlasting life finished in black granite. The entire section sits across the street and within view of the Fr. Solanus Casey Center and St. Bonaventure Monastery and Courtyard, where Blessed Solanus lived for many years.

Blessed Solanus was a Capuchin Friar at St. Bonaventure Monastery for many years and was known to walk the grounds of Mt. Elliott Cemetery in reflection and prayer. During his life Blessed Solanus faithfully served people of Detroit, Huntington, IN, New York City and Yonkers, NY by providing soup for the hungry, kind words for the troubled, and a healing touch for the ill. Wherever he served, people would line up for blocks for a moment with him.



As his reputation for holiness and healing grew, many in the Detroit community came to Blessed Solanus for his prayers as an intercessor to God. Those prayers were often answered in dramatic ways. Because of Blessed Solanus' holiness, Pope John Paul II declared him Venerable in 1995. On May 4, 2017, Pope Francis announced that Venerable Solanus would be beatified, November 18, 2017 at Ford Field in Detroit.
